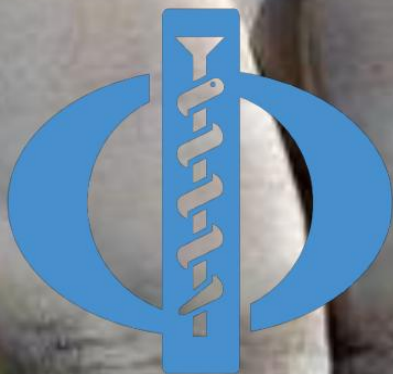

REGULATIONS OF UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

The Department of Physiotherapy is a new Department of University Thessaly (UTH) in implementation of Law 4589/2019 “Synergies between the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, the Agricultural University of Athens, the University of Thessaly with the Technical Institutes of Thessaly and Central Greece, the Pallimniak Fund and other provisions” (Government Gazette 13/A’/29.01.2019). The Department of Physiotherapy of the University of Thessaly is one of the 35 Departments of the University and one of the five Departments of Physiotherapy operating in Greece (University of West Attica - Athens, International Hellenic University - Thessaloniki, University of Patras - Aigio, University of the Peloponnese - Sparta).

1. PURPOSE OF THE REGULATIONS

- Purpose of the Regulations of the Department of Physiotherapy, Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Thessaloniki is the determination of the framework for the organization and operation of undergraduate studies and the informing students about the rights and obligations that arise from their studies in Part.
- The Regulations are posted on the Department's website and students are informed that they are required to read them.

2. IMPORT PROCEDURE

Admission to the Department of Physiotherapy is done with the current system of Panhellenic entrance examinations of the Ministry of National Affairs, for high school graduates, and with placement exams for graduates of other Departments.

2.1. Qualifying examination

The qualifying examinations in the Department of Physiotherapy are conducted in accordance with ministerial decision no. Φ.1/192329/B3 (Government Gazette: 3185-issue B'/16-12-2013) as applicable at each time.

1. The application and supporting documents of graduates who wish to enroll in the Department are submitted to the Department Secretariat from November 1 to 15 of each academic year. The placement exams are held from December 1 to 20 of each academic year. The course examination schedule is announced to the Secretariat and on the Department's website at least ten (10) days before the start of the first course examined. The results of the exams are posted by the Placement Committee on the Department's website.

2. The supporting documents are the following:

a) Request from the interested party

b) Copy of degree or certificate of completion of studies. In the case of foreign graduates, a certificate of equivalence of their degree must be submitted from the Interdisciplinary Organization for the Recognition of Academic and Information Titles (DOATAP) or from a body that has the authority to recognize the degree.

c) Copy of the police ID.

3. The percentage of University Graduates, TEIs or equivalent rankings, ASPAITE of Greece or abroad (recognized by DOATAP) as well as holders of degrees higher schools of over two-year and two-year studies under the responsibility of the Ministry of National Economy and other Ministries, is defined in 12% on of number of imported each academic year in each Part University, TEI or WAIT (Official Gazette) 3185/16-12-2013 t. B'). OR selection of candidates for classification becomes exclusively with written examination in three (3) lessons. The under consideration lessons it is the following: 1. PH1 - Anatomy of the Musculoskeletal System, 2. PH2 - Anatomy of the Nervous System & Organs and 3. PH4 - Physiology.

4. By decision of the Assembly of the Department of Physiotherapy, those classified may be exempted from the examination of courses taught and successfully examined during their studies at Department of origin. By the same decision, those classified are required to be examined in lessons, the which according to with the PPS is judged that not were taught fully in Part origin. The classified are exempted from the examination of courses in which were examined for the classification their, since the lessons these correspond in Curriculum courses (Government Gazette 3185/16-12-2013 vol. B, Article 74 Government Gazette 114/04-08-2017) t. A'), if they have written in the qualifying exams above the base (ten). For the recognition process, students will have to submit a recognition file of number courses, the

which have already be taught and examined successfully in Part origin. The envelope must includes:

- Application recognition with the proposal correspondence courses Department origin -courses of Department Physiotherapy.
- Analytical rating and contour of lesson from the Part of origin, stamped by the Secretariat of the Department of origin.

2.2. Registration - Electronics Services

1. OR procedure registration of imported undergraduate students in Part Physiotherapy is carried out according to with as much as are provided from the according to year circulars registrations successful candidates, transfers and special registrations categories of Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
2. After the procedure identification in Secretariat of Department, the students receive the details of the electronic account they will have as members of the university community. With the activation of electronic account acquire access at below electronic services:
 - Submitting an application for the issuance of an academic identity card (also functions as a "student pass"), via her **Electronics Service Acquisition Academic Identity** <https://submit-academicid.minedu.gov.en/>
 - Submission application for the grant free feeding, using their codes of institutional their account, via her online platform of PTH (<https://merimna.uth.gr/>).
 - Statement courses and monitoring her rating their via her online application her Electronic Secretariat of University of Thessaly. (<https://euniversity.uth.gr/unistudent/>).
 - Declaration of textbook selection for the declared courses, via the Electronic Service Integrated Management Books "Eudoxus" (<https://eudoxus.gr/>).
 - Access and management of electronic mailbox their, via of the **ElectronicPost Office (e-mail)** of the University of Thessaly. (<https://webmail.uth.gr/>).

- Access to the curriculum course pages through the platform **UTH-e-class** (Completed System Management Electronics Courses, [http:// e- class.uth.gr/e-class](http://e-class.uth.gr/e-class)).
3. OR web page of Department Physiotherapy (<https://physio.uth.gr/>) constitutes tool information and information for the activities of Department and for important student issues, such as application deadlines, exam schedule, timetable course schedule, assignment submission dates, lecture dates and topics, etc. **Students are required to regularly visit the Department's website and are informed for topics where their concern.**

3. STUDENTSHIP IN THE DEPARTMENT

Students admitted to the Department of Physiotherapy will attend a pioneering program studies, duration 8 semester (4 years). The structure of the Program is determined according to with the current PPS and any transitional provisions.

3.1. Timeline structure of studies

1. The academic year (AY) begins on September 1st of each year and ends on August 31st of the following year. next.
2. The educational work each SA is structured chronologically in two semesters, the winter (XE) and the spring (EU). The XE begins the secondly fortnight of September and the EU expires the first fortnight of June. The accurate dates are determined from the Senate of University of Thessaly.
3. Each semester includes at least thirteen (13) weeks for teaching and three (3) for examination. In cases of loss hours teaching, because of extraordinary incidents, the teacher takes care of their replacement.
4. An extension of the semester duration is permitted only in exceptional cases in order to the required minimum number of teaching weeks must be completed. The extension does not may exceed two weeks and is carried out by decision of the Rector, after from proposal of the Department Assembly.

5. The exact time structure of studies according to A.E. is described uniformly for all Departments of PTH in the relevant Academic Calendar where is determined on time from the Senate of University of Thessaly.
6. Discontinuation of the educational work and the general operation of the Department of Physiotherapy or the University of Thrace, beyond what is provided for in the law, is possible by decision of the Senate and only for excellent cases.

Additionally, the lessons and the examination are interrupted the following dates:

A) Winter semester : October 28th, November 17th, during the Christmas holidays, on day of celebration of the patron saint of the city of Lamia (October 18th) and January ^{30th} (Feast of Letters-Three Hierarchs).

B) Spring semester : Clean Monday, March 25th, during the Easter holidays which begin on Holy Monday and end on Thomas Sunday, May Day and the feast of St. Spirit and the day of elections (student and rectors).

Classes are also suspended on the Friday preceding and Next Monday national elections (parliamentary, European elections and local government elections). In any case, the Students must be informed by the announcements of the Secretariat of the Department of Physiotherapy and to the follow.

3.2. Program Undergraduate Studies

The undergraduate program (PPS) of the Department of Physiotherapy is prepared by the Assembly of the Department. The PPS is regularly evaluated by the Department Assembly and updated, in order to, on the one hand, any deficiencies are corrected and on the other hand it is harmonized with scientific developments in The Department's academic subjects. The next academic year's PPS is discussed at the Assembly of the Department of Physiotherapy, following the annual internal evaluation reports of the Department's Internal Evaluation Team (OMEA) and recommendations of the Curriculum Committee and the responsible of courses.

1. The lessons of PPS are distinguished in mandatory (Y) and choice (E).
2. The Department of Physiotherapy's CPS follows the model of the *National Authority for Higher Education (NAHE)*. The CPS includes the following course details: the title and type (compulsory, elective), the/the name/s his/her responsible person(s),

the/the name/s his/her teacher/s, the hours theory/lectures, workshops and/or exercises, and the credits of the *European Systemic Transportation and Accumulation Academics Units* (ECTS). Next the course outline, which is organized into the following sections: Purpose, Learning Results, Content, Didactic and Learning methods, Ways Evaluation/Examination, Recommended Bibliography.

3. It is not possible for students who are in a lower level to attend courses. semester from that in which joins the lesson according to with the PPS.
4. The PPS and the outlines of courses are described with detail to the Guide Studies, the any it is posted in the web page of Department Physiotherapy.
5. The PPS included in **Annex A**.
6. To obtain a degree, a minimum of 240 ECTS credits and the attendance of an internship are required. In each semester of studies account for approximately 30 units ECTS.

3.3. Organization teaching

1. OR teaching of courses is taking place according to with the timetable program, the which is drawn up before from the inception of semester with responsibility of President and announced to the students electronics in the web page of Department .
2. The timetable program includes the allocation of hours teaching of courses (lectures, exercises, workshops) within at five working days days her week, their teachers, as well as the halls teaching.
3. The lessons choice are taught, since be declared from one minimum number students, the any determined by decision of the Assembly of the Department of Physiotherapy. In the event that an elective course is not taught due to the small number of number of students where the they declared, the students where the they had choose they can to the replace with another lesson choice.
4. Attendance at the laboratories is mandatory. The number of absences is set at 20% of the mandatory laboratory courses and is stated in the Study Guide of the Department of Physiotherapy.

3.3.1. Declaration and monitoring courses

1. At the beginning of the semester, the student must submit an electronic declaration that includes: the lessons of PPS the which it is going to to watch and/or to examined against the specific semester.
2. The deadlines for submitting declarations are announced by the Secretariat of the Department of Physiotherapy with relevant communication in the web page of Department (<https://physio.uth.gr/>) in the principle of semester and **are strictly adhered to** . After the deadline for submitting course declarations not are made accepted new statements, nor changes in statement where filed on time.
3. Declarations are submitted electronically to the electronic secretariat using personal codes for each student.
4. With this declaration, the student acquires the right to receive the teaching aids and textbooks that available for the lessons these, and to participate in examination of courses where declared.
5. The maximum number of courses that can be registered and in which they can be examined the students, depends on the credit points of each course and cannot exceed thirty-eight (38) ECTS per semester
6. The completion of a thesis is optional (elective course) and is described in detail in **Appendix C**.
7. The students where have complete the 8 semesters of PPS without to have complete the their studies are considered "on I graduate. and in accordance with the provisions in force have right to participate in joint examinations, always following a decision of the Department Assembly.
8. Students who have been graded with a grade of five (5.0) or higher in a course do not have right to the declare again and be examined from new to this.
9. For the September re-examination period, there is no need to resubmit. statement for as much as lessons the students have already choose with electronic statements in the principle of two semester and not have been examined in these or have failed at examination.

3.3.2. Selection books

1. The teachers, before the end each S.A., they choose from the Central Base Data her Electronics Service Integrated Management Literature, the writings where wish to propose during the next AE. The proposed books are approved by the Department Assembly.
2. At the beginning of each semester the Students can declare the textbooks of their choice for the courses they have taken. declare against the current semester via her website "Eudoxus" (<https://eudoxus.gr>).
3. OR statement of books becomes electronics then from relevant communication where is posted in the web page of the Department Physiotherapy (<https://physio.uth.gr/>).
4. OR any failure submission her declaration this one not their excludes from the examination, but are excluded from the free grant of books.
5. When a student registers for a course for the second time during his/her studies (due to B.C. unsuccessful examination) and has received the corresponding book against the first statement of, not has right to received from new book for the lesson this.

3.4. Exams

1. The exams are held exclusively after the end of the X.E. and the E.E. for the courses that were taught in these semesters, respectively. The student can be examined in the courses of both two semesters in the September examination period. There are three examination periods: 1) the January-February, 2) of June and 3) or repetitive of September and last three (3) weeks or each a.
2. The exams are being held exclusively in the Greek language, except for courses taught in English.
3. The exact dates of the exams, the duration, as well as any subsequent modification for serious reasons, are decided by the Senate. The Assembly of the Department of Physiotherapy specifies the program of exams, determining the total duration of exams, the date examination each lesson and the space conducting her.
4. The program of exams is made public from the Secretariat of Department Physiotherapy at least 3 to 4 weeks ago the inception her examination.

5. The prerequisite for participation in the exams is a) the registration of the course in the electronic secretariat, b) the fulfillment of obligations (e.g. attendance) in laboratory exercises (where there are), c) or statement of lesson to the teacher -if this has appointed and announced from of beforehand (B.C. for him determination groups at examination laboratory exercises), as and d) or demonstration academic (student) identity or elsewhere an official document (such as an ID card, passport) for verification of identity by the supervisors. In different case the students not will be done accepted at examination.
6. OR evaluation and or grading in each lesson it is exclusive competence of teacher teacher, with clearly defined evaluation criteria. The final grade of each course may result from the total performance of students in specific areas (e.g. assignments, progress exams, final exams), according to the instructions provided by the teacher in the principle of semester.
7. OR rating her examination each lesson is expressed in a decimal scale from the 0 until the 10 (to one decimal place), in which five (5.0) expresses the basis of success and the ten (10) the excellent.
8. In the Guide Studies of Department and/ or in e-class is listed or against case possibility of examining courses in parts during the semester (Progress Exams), as well as the degree of participation of the score of the (group or individual) exercises in the final grade of The Department Assembly decides on the possibility of a departmental examination of a course.
9. Special care is taken for the oral examination of students with proven prior their admission to the special needs institution, according to the procedure defined by the Structure Support "ACCESS" of PTH (e-mail: prosvasi@uth.gr).
10. OR conduct of exams is taking place according to with the as much as are listed to the Regulation Conducting of Exams (**Annex B**).

3.5. Compliance rules security

Students, when conducting laboratory exercises and during the preparation of their Master's Thesis, must adhere to both the general safety rules, as described in **Appendix E**, and the safety rules established by each Laboratory separately.

3.6. Practice Exercise

The Practical Training (PT) is a mandatory specialty course, which is part of the 8th semester of the Department of Physiotherapy's Curriculum, and its completion is a prerequisite for completing the studies in Physiotherapy and obtaining the degree. A prerequisite for completing the PT is the successful completion of all other specialty courses of the Curriculum. It is supervised by the student's Academic Advisor (Supervising Professor) and is graded by the Academic Advisor.

The internship is carried out in public and private sector positions, following relevant planning and design by the Department's Internship Committee. It is four months long (40 hours/week) and is continuous (not interrupted). The employing institution is required to have a Graduate Physiotherapist, designated as Supervisor (by the institution) for the students' PA throughout the duration of the internship.

More for the practice exercise are mentioned to the Guide her Practical Exercise of Department Physiotherapy (**Appendix D**).

3.7. Calculation degree degree

The degree grade is calculated as the average of the grades of all courses required to complete the studies, after taking into account the weighting factor of each course. The weighting factor is defined by the credit points (ECTS) that each course has. In other words, to calculate the degree grade, the grade of each course is multiplied by the corresponding number of credit points (ECTS) of the course and the sum of the individual products is divided by the total credit points (ECTS) required to obtain the degree, as illustrated in the equation below:

Degree grade = (Grade of course 1 X ECTS of course 1 + Grade of course 2 X ECTS of course 2 ± . .) / Total number of ECTS.

3.8. Evaluation educational process from their students

1. With the completion on ^{the} 8th with 10th week teaching each semester the students of Department Physiotherapy have the right to electronically evaluate the educational process with the aim of improvement so much her effectiveness her teaching, as long as and the future organization of PPS.
2. The Quality Assurance Unit (MODIP) of the University of Thessaly is responsible for the implementation of a six-monthly evaluation her educational process of courses of PPS from their students and provides the tools for the smooth conduct of the process. The OMEA (3-member Internal Evaluation Committee) of the Department, taking into account the results of the internal evaluation of the Department, as given by all students of the Department and teachers, and at the beginning of each calendar year, prepares the Internal Evaluation Report of the Department (for the previous year) with the aim of improving the quality of the educational process. All teachers have access to the results of the evaluation of their courses, as they are sent by the MODIP of the University of Thessaly after the completion of the evaluation, with the aim of improving the quality and effectiveness their teaching.

ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME

ERASMUS is the European Commission's programme for education, training, youth and sport, which aims to strengthen skills and employment as well as to modernise education, training and youth systems, in all areas of Lifelong Learning (Higher Education, Vocational Education and Training, Adult Education, Youth Activities, etc.). The Action in the field of Higher Education is inextricably linked to the Erasmus+ programme and its continuation (Erasmus+ 2021-2027) and subsidises the mobility of students and staff in Higher Education Institutions in Countries participating in the Programme.

The above mobility option concerns undergraduate and postgraduate students, doctoral candidates, as well as faculty members.

Every student has the right to travel for the purpose of studies and internships within the framework of the ERASMUS+ Program.

5. STUDENT INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

For the information of students about with the basic principles and the content of PPS of Department Physiotherapy, of obligations and of rights their is organized each year in the month of October, event information of First-Year Students.

6. DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF TEACHING STAFF

All the members of teaching staff of Department Physiotherapy have the obligation:

- To announce the first week of classes to students who have registered for lesson their analytical chart with the structure her matter of lesson and relevant bibliography.
- Announce the evaluation method during the first week of classes. (examination) of students in lesson that they teach.
- To accept their students specific days and hours each week, where have announced in principle each semester, for topics where concern the educational and research procedure.
- Post support materials (e.g. notes, presentations, etc.) on the e-class platform. bibliography) where judge that needs for the understanding her matter of courses where they teach .
- To submit the exam results to the Department Secretariat no later than ten (10) days from the day of the event her examination.
- Participate in administrative activities that contribute to the smooth implementation of the PPS of Department.

7. STUDENT RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

The students of Department Physiotherapy :

- They have the right to cooperate with the teaching staff for their educational and examination needs. staff of Department, at days and hours where have announced in the principle each semester.
- They have the right to submit questions and requests, which will be answered within a reasonable time. period of time, from the Secretariat of Department.
- They must carry out their educational and examination obligations in accordance with the PPS where was valid the year of their introduction in Part.
- They must monitor and check the accuracy of the registered data and statements courses in the folder their in the electronics secretariat.
- They are responsible for regularly checking the electronic account (e-mail) that has been assigned to them. grant the University of Thessaly, so that to it is strong or information their from the Secretariat or their teachers.
- They have the obligation to they visit often the web page of Department Physiotherapy and to they watch the announcements of Secretariat.
- They have the obligation to they watch the announcements where are posted at pages of courses in e-class or on the board announcements of the workshops or in his website Department (<https://physio.uth.gr/>).
- They are obliged to comply with the University of Thessaly's code of ethics and these Regulations. Operation PPS.

8. SUSPENSION OF STUDIES

Students have the right, upon application to the Dean of the School of Health Sciences (through the Department Secretariat), to interrupt their studies for as many semesters as permitted by the applicable provisions. These semesters are not counted towards the above maximum duration of study. Students who interrupt their studies in accordance with the above do not retain student status throughout the period of interruption of their studies. After the interruption, students return and rejoin the Department.

9. CODE OF ETHICS – PLAGIARISM

1. In PTH valid Code Ethics, so that all the members her academic community, teachers, researchers, students and administrative staff, to they walk together in the application of basic principles of ethics and morals. The Code contains individual provisions related to topics ethics for students .
2. Violation of the provisions of the Code of Ethics constitutes a serious disciplinary offense that implies the enforcement sanctions. Analytical provisions of Code Ethics are presented in address http://www.uth.gr/static/miscdocs/Kwdikas_Deontologias.pdf
3. Each kind plagiarism at tasks of courses or in writing of PE, invention research data and unscientific behavior not may. In cases where it is found plagiarism, or work of lesson or the Thesis zeroed out or is referred for additional processing. If the plagiarism is repeated, the Assembly of the Department of Physiotherapy which decides on the referral of the student to the responsible for enforcement disciplinary penalties, structure of the University of Thessaly.

10. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The present Study Regulations is put in immediate and universal application from the SA 2019 - 2020.
2. For any issues not provided for in this regulation, the PPS of the Department of Physiotherapy will apply. as much as are provided to the Organization and to the Interior Regulation of University of Thessaly.
3. Other issues that may arise and are not provided for by this Regulation or by him Organization and him Interior Regulation of PTH will are regulated with decision her Assembly of Department Physiotherapy.

ANNEX B

EXAM REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOTHERAPY OF UNIVERSITY THESSALY

The dates of the examination periods for each AE are listed in the academic calendar. each year approved by the Senate of the University of Thessaly. The examination schedule for each examination period, as approved by the Department Assembly, is announced by the Department Secretariat. Department and is posted in the web page of Department at least 3-4 weeks before the inception her each examination period.

The exam syllabus for each course must have been posted by the course instructor, electronically in e-class or on the Department's website or in printed form on the Notice Board of Laboratory from the first three weeks of each semester. OR examinee material must also it is available to the students as long as the possible sooner from the inception of semester.

Student performance in each course is assessed by exams. The examination method (written, oral or combined exams) is determined by the course leader and is mentioned in contour of lesson in analytical PPS. OR performance in intermediate tests (progress), assignments on special topics and performance in laboratory exercises can to constitute additives criteria where are taken into account in configuration of final degree.

OR teaching and the examination are made exclusively in the Greek language, unless of courses taught in English.

For their students ERASMUS+ offered list courses for the which the Professor undertakes the obligation to help incoming students analyze in detail a topic related to the course whose evaluation will take place at the end of the period semester in the English language. THE student for the specific lesson will rated taking the corresponding ones academic units (ECTS).

Each academic year includes three examination periods:

- Immediately after the end of the 1st and 2nd semesters during which the teaching courses are examined period which ended and only these.

- Repetitive examination during the September period, in which all subjects are examined lessons either of winter either of spring semester, since but have included in statement preference of the student.

OR rating her examination each lesson is expressed in a decimal scale from the 0 until the 10 (with one decimal place precision), in which 5.0 (five) expresses the basis of success and the ten (10) the excellent success.

1. Participation at examination

- For the participation of students at examination it is **necessary** or statement of lesson in the electronics secretariat. In a few cases will must to become and corresponding statement and to the teacher responsible for the course, if this has been designated and announced by the in advance (e.g. for determining sections in laboratory exercises exams). In otherwise, students will not participate in the exams of that particular examination period.
- In any oral exams, candidates are examined in groups of at least two. people or with the presence of a second person in addition to the examiner.
- Students with disabilities and/or special educational needs (SEN) are considered based on the procedures where have established from the service "Access" of University of Technology. Specifically, via her service Access and her Secretariat of Department in cooperation with the teacher each lesson is decided the way conducting of exams each lesson accordingly the needs and peculiarities each student.

2. Procedure examination

Course exams are given by the instructor (or instructors) at the end of the semester on a specified subject. In case of failure, the student has the option of a supplementary exam in September. If the supplementary exam is also failed, the student will have to re-enroll in the course and attend it in the following academic year.

- The Supervisor, who, together with the Supervisors, is appointed by the Department Assembly, is responsible for conducting the examinations.

- The student, when attending the exams, must bring with him his student or at least his police ID card (for identity verification). The use of mobile phones or other electronic media is prohibited during the exams and it is understood that he leaves his books and notes where indicated. Finally, it is mandatory to complete the student's details (name, student ID, signature) before leaving the exam room.
- The invigilator ensures the preservation of the prestige, reliability and integrity of the exams by properly distributing the students so that no one is allowed visual access to the other's written work.
- No student is allowed to leave the room where the exams are being held before twenty (20) minutes have passed since their start.
- After the presentation or presentation of the topics, no other students are allowed to enter the room and the necessary clarifications are given by the course instructor. To the extent that further clarifications are required, these should be made public. Clarifications are not allowed after the first students have left the room.
- When handing over the written test, the invigilator checks the identity of the examinees.
- In the event of copying, the invigilator informs the Supervisor, initials the slip and expels the student from the room.
- To ensure the reliability of the exams, the last examinee is not allowed to be left alone and the penultimate examinee is asked to remain in the room until the last examinee has handed in their paper.
- After the examination, the invigilators check whether the number of written tests matches the number of examinees and, in case of discrepancy, draw up a relevant protocol.
- The student has the right to be informed by the instructor about the method of grading his/her written work, regardless of the type of examination.
- Changes after the grade has been submitted are only permitted after a written justification from the instructor.

- The written materials are kept under the responsibility of the instructor for a period of one (1) academic year. After that, they may be destroyed.
- Students who wish to see their written work to identify their errors are advised to visit the instructor's office during designated office hours within a reasonable period of time after submitting their grades.

3. Announcement Rating Exams - Evaluations

Course grades must be submitted to the Secretariat as soon as possible and in any case no later than 10 working days from the end of the course examination.

4. Stop or Postponement her Examination

OR examination interrupted or postponed only for reasons superior violence where they make technically participation by the examinees is impossible. In this case the examination is cancelled and A re-examination with a new date is set under the responsibility of the President . examination where interrupted for reasons superior violence is awarded definitely for their examinees where have deliver the written their.

5. Cancellation her examination

Cancellation of the examination may be decided by the responsible supervisor in consultation with the President of the Department. In the event of proven leakage of topics after from decision her Assembly of Department Physiotherapy. The Meeting of Department decides for the need conducting new examination.

6. Compliance of regulation and defense of prestige of exams

The observance of Regulation, the completion of as and the interpretation of the provisions of undertakes or Meeting of Department Physiotherapy.

ANNEX E

PHYSICAL THERAPY DEPARTMENT LABORATORY SAFETY GUIDE OF THE UNIVERSITY THESSALY

1. Meaning of Driver Security - Dangers

The Laboratories of the Physiotherapy Department of the University of ThessalyUn has spaces for practice education of undergraduate students, the completion of degree theses, postgraduate and doctoral theses. The purpose of this Guide is to ensure the security of students (undergraduates, postgraduates, candidates PhDs) and of workers everyone of categories (faculty members, academic staff, administrative staff), as well as to ensure the smooth and proper functioning of laboratories. Safety is the duty of all those involved to the spaces of laboratories.

In the laboratories there are various scientific instruments and materials, the use of which which requires attention and responsibility. The hazards in laboratory areas can be arise a) from the improper use of electrical devices (e.g. various scientific instruments, natural therapy equipment), and b) the development of high temperatures or pressures during the performance of various experimental procedures.

Students and laboratory staff must follow the guide's instructions closely. security of Laboratories mentioned at following sections 2, 3, 4 and 5.

2. General instructions

1. 6. Not may the smoking to the spaces of laboratory, as well as in all areas of the Department.
7. Not may or consumption food or drink to the spaces of Laboratory and in all areas of the Department.

3. Use equipment and consumables materials of laboratory

1. It is not permitted to move instruments, devices and various materials outside the Laboratory. without previous permission of personnel of laboratory.
2. Students must use materials and equipment wisely, carefully and responsibly. equipment of laboratories.
3. In case anyone accident to update immediately the staff of laboratory.
